

Dress up your Teacher!

This event is a great way to get people excited about the Day of Pink!

Steps:

1. Get Permission

- Make sure you speak with the proper individuals such as your principle. Talk to the teachers to see if they will participate.

2. Get Volunteers

- Ask friends, and teachers for help with the organization and advertisement of the event.

3. Advertise

- Use eye-catching and colourful posters or flyers and put them up and hand them out in popular areas. Be sure to include the date, place and purpose of the event.
- Don't forget to have reminders on the morning announcements!

4. Dress up your teacher!

- Have each homeroom class compete to dress up their teacher! The purpose is to dress your teacher up in a way that shows the discrimination faced by individuals. It can be as simple as dressing them in pink or having them dressed as a caricature of a visible minority.
- It is important that every class be able to explain why they dressed their teacher up the way they did. They should be able to explain how it relates to discrimination and what we can learn from it.

5. Find Your Winner!

- At the end of the homeroom period, judge what each class came up with and decide which class was able to come up with the best idea.
- Give the winning class their prize!

Tips:

- Be sure to explain the Day of Pink to the participants beforehand, make sure everyone understands the theme and tell them to have fun!
- Take pictures of some of the teachers and make a display complete with explanations that each class came up with so students can be reminded of the diversity they helped create and so everyone can see the finished product!
