

Sign the Shirt!

This game is a great way to get people excited about the Day of Pink and also for participants to meet new people and have fun!

Steps:

1. Get Permission

- Make sure you speak with the proper individuals such as your principle or boss to ensure that you can use their office or other facilities for distributing prizes to the winner(s).

2. Get Volunteers

- Ask friends, family, co-workers and other members of the community for help with the organization and advertisement of the game.

3. Advertise

- Use eye-catching and colourful posters or flyers and put them up and hand them out in popular areas. Be sure to include the date, place and purpose of the game.
- If the game is being held at a school it would be effective to have it advertised on the intercom or morning/afternoon announcements.

4. Play!

- Have each student compete to get the most signatures on his or her pink shirt in one day!

5. Find Your Winner!

- At the end of the school/work day count the signatures on participating students' shirts.
- Record the names and numbers on a sheet of paper so that you do not lose track! The person with the highest number wins!
- Give the winner their prize!

Tips:

- Be sure to explain the Day of Pink to the participants beforehand, so that they can explain to others why they are wearing pink.
- Have extra pink shirts on hand in case a student writes something discriminating on a shirt.
- Students wearing pink will be showing everybody that they are supporting diversity and standing up against bullying. That way, when a victim needs help they will remember who wore a pink shirt and know that they have support.
- Be sure that students are aware that each person signing a pink shirt is in reality signing a pledge to stand up against bullying!
- After the day is over keep a few of the signed shirts to hang around your school or office so that they Day of Pink and all that it stands for is not forgotten
